

General bounce

This is treated as a soft bounce because we cannot determine the exact reason for delivery failure. Typically this bounce type is associated with a technical issue such as, 'Connection timed out', but we will also classify a bounce as 'general' if the response from the recipient server is open to more than one interpretation. It could be a non-standard error message, or too vague to be useful.

I occasionally get reports from subscribers that they have not received the enews notification. Mostly I have been able to demonstrate that this is incorrect but you should be aware that we do get 20-30 "bounces" each issue. Nearly always categorised as General Bounce.

<u>U.P.P.</u> (<u>United Photographic Postfolios</u>) recently held its Convention and Exhibition at the Hillscourt Conference Centre, Rednal, Birmingham. This is an annual event and is attended by members from all parts of the U.K. As well as being a very enjoyable social occasion, it includes presentations by top speakers, who this year were Leigh Preston FRPS EFIAP MPAGB and Ruth Grindrod. The

Convention includes an exhibition of prints and a projection of members' best work from the last 12 months. This year it was judged by Alison Jenkins ARPS, DPAGB, BPE1*; David Steel DPAGB and Penny Reeves LRPS.

U.P.P. is the U.K.'s best known postal and online club, with a history going back almost 100 years. Its nationwide wide membership is over 200 divided into groups, called Circles, each of 10–15 members. There are three main types of Circle; prints, online and Zoom, some of which are specialist such as infra-red, portrait, phone images, etc. Every month, members submit an image for comment or discussion by others in the Circle which is an excellent way of sharing and enjoying images and exchanging ideas. Workshop Success Print organised by the SCPF

The SCPF held a long-anticipated print workshop in Littleton in November as part of their drive to get more clubs and members (back) into printing. They had something like 75 participants, gratifying. Two attended from the Isle of Wight and even one came from Guernsey, suggests that people are prepared to travel if the subject matter is sufficiently interesting. Maybe your Federation could give it a try?







The aim of the workshop was to encourage new and reluctant printers, demystifying the subject and arming them with appropriate knowledge and to inspire more advanced print workers by, for instance, showing the impact of paper choice on the mood of the image. The day was facilitated by two passionate presenters, Chris Palmer FRPS EFIAP DPAGB APAGB and Tim Jones, Technical manager at Fotospeed.

Tim gave two excellent presentations on the technical aspects of printing; much aimed at the beginner but also with some pearls of wisdom aimed at more experienced workers. Much of Tim's first presentation is covered in Footspeed's free eBook, download from https://fotospeed.com/ebook/artofprinting.

Chris is a Fotospeed Ambassador but his presentations, which were all print based, evangelised print as THE medium in which to enjoy photographic work, rather than promoting the products of a particular supplier. He demonstrated how important paper selection was and he finished the day sharing his FRPS panel of images of monuments on Isola di San Michele, the cemetery island near Venice.



Both Chris and Tim demonstrated their profound knowledge of printing and their generosity in sharing this knowledge with others.

Fotospeed's generosity extended to offering a 25% discount on the day to all present..

Events such as this only come about through the generous gift of time and effort by many volunteers. Thanks to everyone who contributed to this successful event but a special mention to Sue Sibley who conceived the workshop, brought all the moving parts together so successfully and made a passable tea lady!






